

Lunch program available in FISD

Children from families whose income is at or below the level set by the Department of Agriculture are eligible for free or reduced-price breakfast and lunch served by the Farmersville Independent School District.

Those wanting to sign up for the program are encouraged to pick up an application at the Farmersville Child Nutrition Office located at Tatum campus, 405 N. Washington. Applications are also available at each school office and will be sent home with each student the first week of school.

A new application must be completed each school year, even for those who have previously been on the lunch program.

Each household should fill out only one (1) application listing all school children and the school they attend. The parent or guardian will be notified within 10 days after the completed application reaches the Child Nutrition office whether the child has been approved for free or reduced-price meal benefits.

The cost for lunches to students at Tatum and Intermediate is \$1.90 and \$2.15 to students in Jr. High and High School. Breakfast is served in all schools and will be \$1.00. Reduced-price lunches are 40 cents and reduced-price breakfasts are 30 cents.
